General description of roles and responsibilities

The BASP Trainer will be responsible for delivering the BASP first aid and ski patrol training courses to individuals and to the commercial sector. The BASP Trainer will be responsible for delivering these courses at various venues across the UK. They will manage all aspects of the delivery with support from the BASP administration Team.

Key Responsibilities

- To deliver first aid at work and outdoor first aid training courses single handed at various venues and locations across the UK.
- To manage time effectively in order to deliver courses within the timescales allowed.
- To set up course environment with first aid teaching aids, projector, visual aids and candidate workspace.
- To present the BASP quality assured and SQA approved course content.
- To ensure all learning and teaching styles are covered to maximise learning potential.
- To direct candidates through learning resources and assessment as per the SQA guidelines.
- To transport first aid learning resources to and from various venues around the UK.
- To manage equipment requirements for delivery of planned courses.
- To collect and annotate all learning resources and return them to the BASP administration Team in a timely manner.
- To manage course expenses in line with agreed daily amounts and the return of course receipts to BASP Administration Team.
- To work with other BASP Trainers and the BASP Administration Team
- To be integral in training new BASP Trainers through the Trainer Rookie Process or ongoing professional development of the current training body.

- A driving license.
